



Jose Felix Ceballos was born in Venezuela, in a small town called El Tigre in 1982. He began his singing career at the age of five, and in 1992 joined the most famous Latin American Salsa Children's Orchestra called Salserín as one of the lead singers. He spent ten years with the band, participating in the recording of five studio albums and one live album, all of which are internationally recognized and were awarded Gold Record, Platinum and Double Platinum music awards.

As a member of this group he made numerous public appearances in concerts and media in different cities of Venezuela and other countries of South America, Central America, Mexico, USA and Italy. He was considered to be the youngest sonero from Venezuela and shared the stage with the giants of salsa such as: Oscar D'Leon, Gilberto Santa Rosa, Victor Manuelle and Tony Vega. He also starred in a Venezuelan TV mini series produced by Venevision and in a Salserín film called "The first time", which was extremely popular in Latin America.

In 2004 he moved to the city of Beijing in PRC, where he worked for the next four years, participating in various TV shows and salsa festivals. In 2008, Jose Felix Ceballos presented his first solo album, entirely recorded in Venezuela under his musical direction.



In 2010 he worked together with a popular Serbian musician and producer Goran Bregovic on the Spanish version of the Serbian candidate for the Eurovision Song contest "Ovo je Balkan" ("Hey Balcañeros"), and also on the song called "Presidente Alo", now performed by a famous Spanish band "Gipsy Kings".

In 2014 Jose Felix began a Latin-American tour promoting his second solo album, also entirely recorded in his native Venezuela.

In Serbia, he's performed on various occasions with the band "Mambo Stars" whose music director is Jose's close friend.
